About Museum Futures

The programme is a partnership of museums across the UK working together to encourage new entrants into the museum sector who are interested in gaining digital skills and heritage experience. As a trainee at the Irish Linen Centre and Lisburn Museum, you will benefit from the network of other participating museums through regular training sessions and the community of Museum Futures trainees across the UK.

The aim of this programme is to seek out people aged 18-24 who may not have considered a career in museums. The programme aims to attract candidates who have the digital confidence to work on new digital projects including digitisation of objects and digital engagement online.

Trainees will complete an accredited Level 3 diploma in Cultural Heritage and gain in-work skills training and experiences to add to their CV and further their career opportunities. For these reasons we encourage people aged 18-24 that have not completed an undergraduate degree to apply.

Please Note:

Candidates with over six months paid or unpaid experience of working in a museum and/or a postgraduate qualification in a related area are not eligible to apply.

The Trainee receives a training bursary, and is not an employee of LCCC or The British Museum

About the Irish Linen Centre & Lisburn Museum

The Irish Linen Centre & Lisburn Museum is located in Market Square, the historic centre of Lisburn, and last year over 158,000 visitors enjoyed the Museum's exhibitions, events and education programmes. The Museum collects objects, and houses archives relevant to the history of Lisburn, Castlereagh, Lagan Valley, and the Irish linen industry.

Role Description

1. The Museum Futures trainee will help digitise and catalogue aspects of the Museum's collections, archive, and reference library for visitors, online and internal museum use. For example, photographing linen damask napkins and entering relevant data into a spreadsheet.
 2. The chosen candidate will receive full training on cataloguing and digitising assets (for example, using spreadsheets, taking photographs and uploading data to a website), and gain experience working with a range of software tools, e.g. collections management.
 3. The trainee will work closely with museum staff to prepare material for exhibition, as well as mount exhibitions in galleries.
 4. The chosen candidate will gain experience working with various teams in the museum, including Education, Front-of-house, Collections and Research.
 5. There may also be regular contact with different museum specialists, organisations, and the general public.
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Key Responsibilities

- Support the digitisation of the Museum's collections
- Support the cataloguing of archival and reference material
- Assist in making the collection available and easily accessible online
- Assist in the production and cataloguing of photographic record prints
- Complete all required documentation for the Level 3 Diploma in Cultural Heritage

- Commit to attend 10 training sessions over the course of the year, hosted at Museum Futures partners in England (travel expenses will be covered).
- Commit to attend several events at The British Museum
- Assist in the coordination of one training session at the Irish Linen Centre & Lisburn Museum for the wider Museum Futures network
